Introduction to the directory



- This directory of resources has been compiled as part of the series of workshops provided to teachers and others working in education to teach Partition and imperial histories to Key Stage 3 students.
- This project aimed to bridge the gap of understanding between the role of the British empire in the history of Partition, and of South Asia more generally, and how the legacy of this violent event is still felt in the UK. This programme of workshops aimed to support teachers to develop the confidence and knowledge to discuss these topics in the classroom and was based on the underpinning research of the MMPI project and the contributions of key educational and cultural organisations which are currently working to increase awareness of the history and legacy of British imperial history in society: A Little History of the Sikhs; Inspirate; Project Dastaan; The Partition Education Group; The Samosa Media.


